Settling in and beginning to build relationships

We are so proud of how well each child has settled into Nursery over the last two weeks. The children have been exploring the nurturing environments, settling into our daily routine, and getting to know their peers, key person and fellow staff members. Thank you so much for your continued support and understanding as your child transitions into Nursery either for the first time or following the summer break. Children respond differently to transitional events, and as team we actively ensure that each child and their family work closely with us to create a smooth, flexible, and individualised transition into our setting.

Our Learning Journey

So far this term, our child-led approach has led us to go blackberry picking, make blackberry crumble, explore different mark-making techniques with hammers, wheels and hoops, make large scale art pieces outdoors, create snail art, fly kites and explore our Forest School area, wooden fort and field. Here are just a few photographs of the amazing adventures we have had over the last two weeks!



We have also been enjoying developing a love of books through our focus stories and 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley' has become a popular story with the children.



The sensitively written story has highlighted environmental issues and provoked discussions about plastic pollution, caring for our animals and planet and the importance of reusing and recycling our plastic bags. Following our storytelling sessions, the children, within their key families have made environmental pledges, introduced eco-bricks to our lunch tables and created their own Stanley's which they have been enjoying flying them around the school field.

"Plastic bags don't belong in the ocean blue, creatures think you're a jellyfish and swallow you!"

Some facts about plastics

- 18 billion pounds of plastic waste flows into the oceans every year from coastal regions.
- Plastic impacts entire food chains sea, soil, plants, and creatures. Scientists predict that every seabird and every turtle on this planet have plastic in their stomachs.
- Reducing, reusing, recycling, and picking up plastic makes a life-or-death difference to ocean life.
- Our actions have global effects as currents transport plastics across continents. There is even evidence of plastic pollution on the North Pole.

A recording of one of our 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley' story sessions has been uploaded to Tapestry so that you can enjoy sharing the story with your child at home and talk about the problems one simple plastic bag can create in the oceans and all the creatures Stanley meets on his journey.

Our termly learning journey is proudly displayed in Nursery so please make sure you pop in regularly and look at what other things we have been experiencing, enjoying, and learning about.

Tapestry

All our new parent/carers have now been set up on Tapestry and should have received their activation email direct from Tapestry (please check your junk folder if you have not received the email into your inbox).



Tapestry is an easy-to-use application which allows us to share what the children have been doing as well as our focus story and song sessions, activities, and enrichments events. This gives you the opportunity to support your child's learning further at home. We actively encourage our families to upload observations from home and create a joint two-way sharing document.

Please may we remind you not to electronically share by social media or other platforms, any part of your child's learning journal (including photographs and videos). If you require

any support in accessing your child's Tapestry account, adding, and uploading home observations or locating Nursery's Communication Folder, please do not hesitate to contact a member of the Nursery team for assistance.

Nursery Gate – Drop Off and Collection Times

In response to our current family's needs and the feedback we have received, Nursery are pleased to be able to offer a selection of flexible drop off and collection times throughout our day.

Breakfast Club Drop Off: Children who are booked in for breakfast club need to be dropped off at the school's pupil entrance gate between 7.30 a.m. and 8.10 a.m. On arrival, please press the breakfast club bell, located next to the internal green gate and a member of staff will come to the gate and welcome your child into the school hall. Prior to the start of our morning session, the children attending breakfast club will be escorted down to Nursery by a member of staff.

Morning Session, Lunch Time Session and Afternoon Session Drop Off: Children who are booked in for an 8.30 a.m., 11.30 a.m. or 12.30 p.m. start need to wait by the green Nursery gate (located to the right-hand side of the school office entrance). At these times, a member of staff will come up and open the gate. Parent/Carers are very welcome to walk their child down the path to the Nursery door or come in and settle their child at the start of the session.

End of Morning Session, Lunch Time Session and Afternoon Session Collection: Children who finish at 11.30 a.m., 12.30 p.m. and 3.30 p.m. will need to be collected from the Nursery entrance. Please can we ask that parent & carers wait at the Nursery gate and a member of staff will come down the path and open the gate.

Please note that the Nursery gate is opened at 3.20 p.m. at the end of the day to allow families that are collecting older siblings from school the option of collecting their Nursery child straight away. The gate will remain open for parent/ carers to collect their child up until 3.30 p.m.

After-School Club Collection: Children who attend our early years after-school club need to be collected from our main school office entrance. On arrival, please inform a member of the office team or ring us directly on Nursery's telephone number: This number is also displayed on the main door. Please feel free to come into the entrance and take a seat whilst your child is brought up to you.

If you miss the drop off gate times or need to collect your child early e.g., to attend a medical appointment, please come to the main school office entrance and a member of the office staff will happily contact a member of Nursery staff for you.

Nursery's 2022-23 Curriculum

Following on from welcoming and settling our new and returning children into Nursery this term, we would very much appreciate your thoughts, ideas and opinions on what you would like the children to learn and experience this year in Nursery. These will be weaved into Nursery's 2022-23 curriculum, along with the children and staff's views and then shared as a reflective overview. Illness and Covid-19

Please remember that if your child is feeling under the weather, they do not come into Nursery until they are better. With sickness and diarrhoea, it is a 48-hour exclusion period from their last bout of sickness and/or diarrhoea and for information regarding Covid-19, please ensure you follow the current advice given from the NHS.

We understand that it can be hard when working to find childcare when your little one is poorly, however the more unwell children we have at Nursery, the quicker it will spread to both other children and the staffing team.

<u>This is Me!</u>

As the children continue to settle in and we get to know each other, we ask that you view our 'Home Help Observation', which has been added to your child's Tapestry account. We would be very grateful if you could upload photos of your child's favourite people, current interests and places they like to visit onto Tapestry. Your photos will then be printed and added to your child's individual Nursery photo album, which they have access to and enjoy sharing and talking about in Nursery.

By getting to know your child's likes and dislikes helps to ensure that we are keeping the children's environment relevant and stimulating to their current interests and needs. Please also add any further details to your child's All About Me section on Tapestry and please do not hesitate to ask a member of the team if you need any help accessing or uploading your photos to your child's Tapestry account.

Nursery Cooked Lunches

We are fortunate to be able to offer cooked meals as part of our Nursery lunch club. Meals cost £2.38 per day, and they can be booked via our online booking link. Each meal is cooked on site by Chartwell's dedicated kitchen staff and our meals consist of a protein item (either meat, fish or vegetarian options), 2 vegetables (e.g., broccoli/sweetcorn/ carrots), a starchy carbohydrate (e.g., pasta/rice/potato), and a pudding.

Last week the children enjoyed tucking into healthy, nutritious meals that included roast chicken freshly baked pizza and fish and chips.
